Dear Good Samaritan Mission Friends,

"We were robbed" are words I could never imagine hearing. I will never forget that morning when I walked up to the mission to find volunteers, Maggie and Bev, trying to make sense of what happened when they arrived just a few minutes earlier. The next hour revealed the reality that we were robbed.

We discovered the break-in occurred through our Hygiene Program door. We followed the trail of glass and disarray into the front office where everything was turned upside down. The contents of cabinets were overturned, papers and supplies were everywhere. A laptop, cash donation box and petty cash box was taken. We felt so violated and unsafe. We kept asking these questions—how could someone do this? how could someone rob a charitable mission who serves people in need? They could have easily walked into the mission and asked for help.

Once the robbery made the news, the community support was overwhelming. We received so many phone calls and personal visits offering support for what had just happened to Good Sam. An anonymous note was taped to the door the next day that read "The Good Samaritan Mission helps those in need, so the Danville Community will stand behind you and help the mission in need". I was very humbled by this act of kindness. We are so thankful for the outpouring support from the community and the generosity we received. Thank you to the Danville Police Department for their service during this time.

So, even though we experienced something awful, in turn, we experienced something amazing out of it.

Our support goes out to the churches who also walked this same journey of loss.

In closing, if you knew Sandy O'Rourke, she would be praying for the two individuals who committed this crime. I continue to do just that.
