LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear Good Samaritan Mission Friends,

As 2022 comes to an end, I'm reminded of why we do what we do at Good Sam. I, along with Good Sam volunteer program staff, had the opportunity to meet a unique young woman who stood out to us in so many ways. Despite facing the challenges of overcoming a difficult childhood and being a single mom, she was determined to change her situation and make a life for herself and her two small children. This is her story.

"Growing up I didn't understand healthy relationships. I didn't know what true support, trust, and love really felt like. I didn't have the kind of support that I needed to develop healthy life choices. All I knew was how to survive in my own unhealthy ways.

When I was 17, I had my first child, a son Elijah. I went through many trials as a young, single mom. I became pregnant with my second child, a daughter, Samyrah 4 years later. I knew I needed to make a change and relocated to Danville where I was able to stay at The Gatehouse until I was able to get on my feet. I met a woman who began to guide me and provided me with love and support. Eventually this woman would become my adoptive mother. She opened her arms to me and my small family. While at The Gatehouse, I was referred to The Good Samaritan Mission. I was going through hardship after hardship and needed additional support. They have so many programs that helped me in many ways. I was able to get assistance with a security deposit when I was ready to leave The Gatehouse and get my own apartment, clothing for myself and my kids, and hygiene products. They also offered a class called "Getting Ahead" which taught me how to motivate myself to search for additional resources in the community, make better choices, build relationships and how to better handle my finances. For me, it wasn't just about the financial assistance, clothing or hygiene products, the mission staff was able to help keep me strong when I felt like I had no other way. I really appreciated how they respected my faith and were able to keep me strong in it. They helped by guiding me and being there when I needed to talk to someone, encouraging me and by also praying with me. It's because of Good Sam that I was able to stay on my feet for myself and my kids. I wanted to share my story, so that hopefully it will help someone else who faced challenges like me".

We are very proud of Dee and the determination she has shown to break the cycle of poverty and make a change for herself and her family. There are so many others in the Danville community who will be impacted by what Good Sam can do for them. Your financial support will allow us to continue to help others just like Dee.
